Dear Community Member,

Last week, we launched Phase 3 of our vaccination plan, with online vaccine registration now open for people who are eligible at gov.bc.ca/getvaccinated. This is a major milestone in our fight against COVID-19. You can follow an easy three-step process to get your vaccine:

- **Step 1: Register when it is your turn and get a confirmation code.** This confirmation code will allow you to book your vaccination appointment when you are eligible and registering helps our health authority request the right number of doses for each community. **As of today, those aged 55+ (Born 1966 or earlier),** Indigenous peoples aged 18+, or those who are [clinically extremely vulnerable](#) can register. Make sure to check gov.bc.ca/getvaccinated for the current eligibility.

The scheduled vaccination eligibility for the next week is:

- Wednesday, April 14 – People age 50+ (Born 1971 or earlier)
 - Friday, April 16 – People age 45+ (Born 1976 or earlier)
 - Monday, April 19 – People age 40+ (Born 1981 or earlier)
- **Step 2: Book an appointment.** You will be contacted by email or text message to book an appointment when you are eligible, based on your age and [our Immunization Plan phases](#).
 - **Step 3: Get the vaccine.** Visit the vaccine clinic to get your first dose. People who get their first vaccine dose will be notified by email, text, or phone call when they are eligible to book an appointment for their second dose.

To date, we have administered over 1.1 million doses —that means one in six people in British Columbia has been vaccinated. In the Fraser Health region almost 400,000 people have been vaccinated. Every person who gets vaccinated makes us all safer.

50+ (born 1971 or earlier)	Online, by phone or in-person at a Service BC office	Wednesday, April 14, at 12PM
45+ (born 1976 or earlier)	Online, by phone or in-person at a Service BC office	Friday, April 16 at 12PM
40+ (born 1981 or earlier)	Online, by phone or in-person at a Service BC office	Monday, April 19 at 12PM
Indigenous peoples 18+ (born 2003 or earlier)	Online, by phone or in-person at a Service BC office	Ongoing
55 to 65 (born 1956-1966)	Call a participating pharmacy near you (Dependent on supply)	Ongoing
People who are clinically extremely vulnerable 16+ (born 2005 or earlier)	Must have an invitation letter to book	Ongoing

***There can be a wait time between when you register and when you are invited to book your appointment. Wait times vary depending on your age and vaccine supply.**
